A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 21:28-32

The parable which he tells the chief priests and elders of the people in today's Gospel witnesses Jesus cutting to the core: he is not impressed by the spinning of fine words; he looks into the human heart and sees the truth which may be hiding behind those fine words. In the parable, the first son refuses to work in the vineyard at the request of his father, but subsequently thinks better of it and does his father's bidding. He changes his mind and his heart. His actions speak louder than do his former words.

The second son's words in response to his father's request that he work in the vineyard, 'Certainly, sir,' are beautifully polite but mean nothing. He has no intention of doing his father's bidding. Truth is sacrificed without a second's thought.

The parable is comforting, as Jesus means it to be. We are fallen, flawed creatures, a fact we acknowledge in the truth of our hearts. We are flawed, yes, but we are also capable of repentance; we are capable of deep sorrow for our offences against love, and this deep sorrow opens the door to forgiveness for us. The parable reminds us that, as penitents, we are regularly washed clean by the ever-flowing grace and mercy of Love itself.

Jesus, we live in a world which sacrifices truth constantly. May we consciously revive our love and respect for truth and hold it as dear as you did. May we remind ourselves daily that our actions speak louder than our words, and that it is by our actions we are truly known.

During National Year of Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood we pray that those the Lord is calling today to go and work in His vineyard will have the courage to say, "Yes" and the grace to work faithfully in building up God's kingdom on earth - a kingdom of justice, truth, holiness, equality, love, and peace.
