27th Sunday in Ordinary Time A Short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith."

Jesus makes it clear in today's Gospel that it isn't the size of our faith which is the problem, rather it is our failure of tolerance for uncertainty. We remember Jesus admonishing Thomas for needing the visible, incontrovertible proof of his own eyes before he was willing to accept his master's resurrection, and we remember Jesus' blessing for those of us who have faith without need of that same visible proof. If our faith is lived faith, it can accommodate uncertainty; it can be the size of a tiny mustard seed and still 'move mountains'. It is living by faith through the joys and sorrows of life, the gains and the losses, the torments and the consolations, which Jesus asks of us. His life, his passion and his death show us the way; his resurrection is our promise of eternal bliss if we are faithful to his teachings.

Today's Gospel also advises humility. Jesus reminds us that even if we live virtuous, faith-filled lives, we should not claim credit, because, after all, we are merely doing what we are obliged to do. All in all today's Gospel is stern and uncompromising, but it needs to be. Jesus has limited time at his disposal and his desire for our salvation is acute. He is unwilling to waste a moment, and he doesn't. He wants us to listen to his words and take heed of them.

Jesus, may we listen to your words and live by them. May we live out our faith through all of life's doubts and uncertainties, through its joys and its sorrows; and as our lives come to their end, may we be steadfast in our faith that we will soon be in the presence of God and hear with joy His loving words, "Welcome, good and faithful servant."
