A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 13:33-37

Today's Gospel has often been associated with death: a warning that we must stay awake because death may come for us when we least expect it. But a deeper, more immersive reading reveals a different meaning altogether. We should always be fully awake, fully alert, fully present, because it is incumbent on us to find God in what is right in front of us. God is always present; it is we who are not; it is we who are constantly sleeping and unconscious of the glorious presence of God. The French Jesuit and mystic, Jean Pierre de Causade, writes about 'the sacrament of the present moment' and it is the present moment to which we must be fully alert, fully awake. God was present in Gethsemane, but Jesus' friends missed Him. Instead, they slept. They hadn't yet learned to see.

'If your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light. (Luke 11:34)

Jesus, may we always be fully aware of your loving presence and openly, totally, embrace it.
