

A Short Reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 3:1-12

Today's Gospel presents us with the powerful, vigorous, non-, conformist figure of John the Baptist. Far from any centre of power, dressed in a garment made of camel hair with a leather belt around his waist, he preaches repentance in the wilderness of Judaea. The word "repent" means "to change direction"; in other words, to turn away from one's sinfulness, and to turn one's face to the light of God's loving forgiveness. Both Jesus and John the Baptist preached repentance leading to forgiveness, a message which challenged self-satisfaction, spiritual torpor, attachment to worldly power, all of which characterised the Pharisees and Sadducees of the day. This is why John singled those two groups out and passionately denounced them.

One of the most satisfying things about John the Baptist is, that, although people flocked to him, drawn to his powerful, unconventional presence and his passionate preaching, he knows exactly who he is: he is one who is preparing the way for his Lord and Master, Jesus, who will baptise with the Holy Spirit and with fire, while he, John, baptises with water only. John refuses to be elevated to anything other than what he knows himself to be.

Lord Jesus, let us embrace, with the passion and truth of John, our baptism with the Holy Spirit and with fire.

Let us remember who we are in God's eyes and resist the temptation to elevate ourselves to a false self for the eyes of the world.
