A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 23: 1-12

Today's Gospel according to Matthew witnesses Jesus' warning to his disciples not to discard the truth because it comes from the mouths of venal people: the Scribes and the Pharisees. The truth is the truth even when vainglorious people, purporting to be closer to God than anyone else, use it as a cloak of righteousness which entitles them to worldly honour, attention and privilege. In Jesus' eyes these are noisy, attention-seeking people who may be speaking the truth while their actions are a flat denial of the truth. While Jesus calls us to love, these people are false leaders who burden 'little people' with a heavy weight of guilt but 'will not lift a finger to move them'.

Today's Gospel invites us to ask ourselves a number of questions:

Am I the Pharisee, the Scribe? Am I guilty of their offences?

Am I lacking in modesty and humility?

Do I make a big display of my religion? Are my actions failing to match my words?

Do I stay with the humbling realisation that I am totally dependent on God for life and love? Do I stay with the words of Jesus, the inversion which governs the kingdom of God: 'Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Jesus, may we be searingly honest when we examine our conscience so that we leave ourselves open to your mercy, love, forgiveness, and compassion.
