### A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 10:2-16

Once more Jesus places love at the centre of his teaching, as his enemies try to trap him within the meshes of the law. They ask him whether or not he approves of the law which allows a man to divorce his wife. God had created man and woman equal, but humankind had decreed differently. Jesus' response to his enemies' sly question is beautiful in its unequivocal clarity. Moses' permission for a man to divorce his wife, Jesus states, was his reluctant response to man's sinfulness. In other words, divorce happened as a concomitant of the fallen world. God had created man and woman equal and beautiful and it was His desire that they should live together in mutual love and harmony. The fall of humankind had sundered apart God's desire, and only the restoration of pure love could heal the resultant brokenness.

Later, when the little children came flocking to Jesus, his disciples wanted to send them away but Jesus forbade them to, insisting as he had done before that only with the trusting innocence of the child, only with the unconditional love a child offers, can we attain the kingdom of God. For Jesus, that pure heart, that unquestioning sense of wonder and awe and that complete acceptance of the miraculous which is the daily experience of the child, is the key which opens the door to eternal life for all of us. Jesus, may we cultivate within us the pure heart of the child. May we be filled with the child's wonder and awe at the miracles of this created world, and may we unquestioningly open ourselves to the eternal truth of God's existence.

**Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood** – Whilst this weekend's readings speak to us about the vocation of marriage and invite us to pray for engaged and married couples, we pray also for those called to serve as priests of this diocese, thinking particularly of the four men to be interviewed next weekend as they hope to begin seminary studies in January.
