A short reflection on today's Gospel John 10:27-30

I know my sheep and they follow me.

Today's Gospel is a clear and powerful explication of the relationship we need to have with Jesus if we are to attain eternal life.

Jesus describes himself as The Good Shepherd who knows his sheep and whose sheep know him and follow only him. To truly know someone is to know that person with your mind, with your heart, and with your soul. This is how Jesus wants us to know him. This is how he knows us.

Jesus wants us to hear him, to listen to his words with all of our minds, all of our hearts and all of our souls. To listen to Jesus as he wants us to listen to him is to believe him, to obey him, and to follow only him. It is to follow him with trusting, fearless hearts, in the full knowledge that he is leading us into eternal life. It is to know that he will never abandon us, even when we believe we are lost. It is to know that no power on earth or anywhere else will ever be able to steal us away from his loving care.

Jesus, we thank you for the loving care you take of us. May we always listen to your words and truly hear them. May we always be faithful to you; may we always follow you, only you, in the knowledge that you are leading us safely into Paradise.
