

A short reflection on today's Gospel

Today's Gospel is harrowing, laying bare, as it does, the ingratitude, betrayals, violence and greed of which humanity is capable. It also delivers a clear message to those who either reject or ignore the will of God: they will be denied access to His kingdom, come to a wretched end, and their places will be taken by the faithful.

The parable told by Jesus to the chief priests and elders of the people begins with the imperative, 'Listen!' a word designed as a warning that what is to follow should not be taken lightly. The creator and master of the vineyard in the story is someone to be admired: caring, fashioning his creation with loving expertise and diligence, trusting and generous. All he asks in return is loyalty. What he receives from the tenants to whom he leases his vineyard is ingratitude and murderous betrayals. They abuse the servants he sends to collect his produce, and when he sends his beloved son, thinking that his wretched tenants will surely respect his son, they kill him. Retribution, Jesus informs the chief priests and elders of the people, will surely and swiftly follow when the master of the vineyard returns.

Lord, you have experienced ingratitude and betrayals. You have been humiliated, rejected and abused. But we know that as long as there lives in our hearts the desire to look upon your face, the way of salvation remains open to us.
