A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 3:20-35

Today's Gospel is challenging, even disturbing, with its account of the terrible accusation levelled at Jesus by the incensed scribes: they accuse him of being an instrument of Satan. They have witnessed his miracles of healing, the banishment of unclean spirits, and other manifestations of his divine agency, and yet, in their blind resentment of what they see as a threat to their hitherto unquestioned religious authority, they insist his power comes from Satan. Jesus points out the contradiction, the illogicality of their accusation: "How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that household cannot stand."

And there was more to come. The family of Jesus have also arrived to see him, concerned and confused, maybe even embarrassed by their relative's prominence in the community, his fame. It's obvious they want to take him home and hide him away, convinced 'he was out of his mind'. Jesus is crystal-clear in his response to their efforts to take charge of him:

"And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother."

Jesus, may we follow your guidance in all things. You never sought to 'fit in'! You never deviated from the truth, and you were fearless in your defence of that truth. May we, too, never care whether or not we 'fit in' with a world which is hostile to our faith, which seeks to blind us to the truth of the God of love to whom nothing is outside the scope of His divine grace.

Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood - When Jesus is told, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are asking for you," he replies, 'Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.' We pray for those hoping to serve as priests of the diocese of Derry, that they will do the will of God.

Bishop McKeown will join ministers of our Christian denominations at what is believed to be the city's first inter-faith celebration of St Columba's Day. The service starts at 4.00pm today (Sunday), gathering outside St Augustine's Church of Ireland on the Walls. Incorporating a sung version of the prayer attributed to St Columba, Alone With None But Thee My God, and excerpts from the Amrah Cholm Cille, the celebratory event will take no more than one hour. Everyone is welcome.
