### A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew: 11-25

# You have hidden these things from the wise and revealed them to little children.

In today's Gospel, Jesus thanks his heavenly Father for entrusting the truth to little children instead of to an adult world which may be a world of great learning, a world which considers itself to be the repository of irrefutable wisdom. Why should this be so? What is it about little children which explains God's choice of them to reveal his truth?

Trust lies at the heart of a child. Until the adult world convinces her/him otherwise, a child is filled with wonder and awe at the miracles of the created world she/he witnesses with every sunrise, and is tender beyond words in caring for that world. Someone once advised going for a walk in the company of a child if you need a tonic for your soul.

A child knows only love before the adult world gets the opportunity to teach hatred. Belief in a loving God comes easily to a child. Lacking the sophistication to speak anything but the plain truth, a child's prayer must touch God's loving heart like nothing else.

Today's Gospel ends with a beautiful promise from Jesus, a promise overflowing with love and compassion from the one who shared in every aspect of our humanity: joys and sorrows, love, grief, pain and suffering:

'Come to me you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest.'

Jesus, restore our hearts and minds to the love, trust, and truth of a child, so that we experience the joy of true spirituality.

Jesus, may we remember that pain and joy do not wipe each other out: they belong together and allow each other meaning. Amen.
