A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 12:38-44

Jesus' message in today's Gospel is clear and direct: beware of confusing a cultivated image with true worth. The scribes, doctors of the law, were full of self-importance. They were in love with the awe their learning and function inspired in others, and unscrupulous regarding their own frequent tendency to exploit the most vulnerable in society: widows and orphans. Neither were they concerned about the discrepancy between their rigid interpretation of God's law where others were concerned, and their own dubious moral standards.

Today's Gospel is in two parts and these two parts are linked together in terms of the meaning they impart: it is the truth in the heart which God sees, and it is to the heart's truth that God responds. The widow appears in both parts of the Gospel, as an image of vulnerability in the first part who deserves to be protected, not exploited, and in the second part as an image of selfless generosity. She quietly gives from the little she has to the treasury and leaves herself with hardly anything. The rich give ostentatiously and expect their magnanimity to be loudly acknowledged.

Jesus, may we live our lives humbly, generously, and truthfully. The world often fails to see the truth which is in our hearts, but you always see that truth clearly. What lay in the widow's heart was an extraordinary generosity. What lay in the hearts of the scribes was duplicity, inordinate vanity, and greed. You and your heavenly Father see directly into the truth. May we live always in your light, openly, cleanly, and at one with your love.
