A short reflection on today's Gospel John 6:41-51

Today's powerful Gospel issues us with the awe-inspiring invitation to take God into ourselves and to become one with Him: we are invited to the Eucharistic table to take into ourselves the good bread, the living bread, the bread of love, the bread of forgiveness, the bread of compassion.

The Gospel opens with the Jews complaining among themselves about what they consider to be Jesus' temerity in claiming to be 'the bread that came down from heaven.'

'Isn't he only the son of Joseph the carpenter and Mary, his wife', they murmur, 'ordinary people we know well!' Once again, they display their earth-bound prejudices. Once again their sense of awe is blunted by their stubborn insistence that greatness cannot possibly reside in the person of the ordinary and the familiar.

Jesus dismisses their murmurings with more than a degree of impatience at their lack of openness of mind and heart. He goes on to state that God, his Father, draws us to Him because He loves us, and He draws us to Him only through His beloved Son, Jesus. It is only through our commitment to the teachings of Jesus, to taking into ourselves his life, death and resurrection that we can sit at the Eucharistic table and eat the good bread of eternal life.

Jesus, may our hearts and minds be open always to the wonder of the extraordinary present in the lives of the ordinary, the humble and the familiar. May our sense of awe before the miraculous never be blunted by our exclusive, earth-bound reverence for the possessors of worldly power and status.

Jesus, may our ability to discern the bad food from the good food grow daily. May we always feel the need to eat better food and so take into our souls the food of love, forgiveness, and compassion.
