

A short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 6: 6-11

Is it against the law on the Sabbath to save life?

In today's Gospel Jesus once again places compassion and love at the centre of his ministry. As the instrument of his heavenly Father he never deviates from these key principles of his Father's salvation plan. The Scribes and the Pharisees often hide behind their rigid laws and protocol at the expense of compassion. Jesus, throughout his ministry, is intent on restoring human dignity to those who are suffering by liberating them from life's cruel blows. If it's a question of the rule of love versus the rule of law, the rule of love will always win with Jesus.

Jesus, guide us as we strive to walk in your footsteps. May we never seek to hide behind protocol, habits or laws which clearly do not reflect the Gospel message, and may we be aware always that the key principles of that Gospel message are compassion and love. May our actions towards others always reflect this truth.

Jesus, you healed the man's withered, useless hand, a healing born of compassion and love for which you were excoriated by your enemies because it was carried out on the Sabbath. Your response to their sour objections was clear and unequivocal: 'Is it against the law on the Sabbath to save life!' In other words, it is never the wrong time to do good. Teach us, Jesus, to bring back to life this truth which may lie withered and useless in our hearts.

The Death of Father Aidan Mullan Administrator of St Columba's Church, Long Tower

It is with deep sadness and a profound sense of loss that we announce the death of Fr Aidan Mullan.

An Omagh man, Fr Aidan attended the Christian Brothers School there before attending St Columb's College, Derry, as a boarder. He was ordained a Priest in 1976. He was a man gifted with a fine intellect which he employed generously throughout his life in the service of others, first serving as a Maths teacher at St Columb's College before later going on to be Vice Principal. A strong advocate of Catholic education, he chaired the Diocese of Derry CCMS board for a number of years.

Serving as a diocesan priest he ministered to the Glendermott, Dungiven, and Three Patrons Parishes. In September 2016 Fr Aidan was appointed as the new administrator of the Long Tower Parish, a position to which he devoted the rest of his life with great warmth, zeal and giftedness.

We mourn his loss as a man and priest of outstanding integrity who lived the Gospel values each day with faith, compassion and love. He leaves behind a strong legacy of Christianity in action and a deep-seated belief in the power of prayer to heal the world.


Blessed Carlos Acutis
