

### A short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 6:17, 20-26

Happy are you who are poor, who are hungry, who weep.

Today's Gospel, according to Luke, presents us with four beatitudes each of which has a parallel warning or woe. The poor, the hungry, the grieving and the abused are described by Jesus as the blessed who will find favour with God; the rich, the well-fed, those whose lives are privileged and seem insulated from grief and abuse, are warned that riches and possessions are not to be depended upon, and woe to those who wrongly identify the source of our eternal happiness. This is a truly powerful message which Jesus directs at his disciples, a message which has been described as the framework for Christian living. His disciples are poor: their lives are without any material privileges, and they will suffer at the hands of those who hate the ministry of Christ. But they are called blessed by God; their eternal happiness is assured. The rich and powerful on the other hand, if they believe in worldly power as the only source of all happiness, if they live their lives indifferent to the needs and the tears of others, they, according to Jesus, are in deep trouble.

Jesus may we always be aware of the seductiveness of worldly power and possessions. May we be aware of the danger inherent in the world's promises that it can answer all of our needs provided we embrace and live out of its philosophy of self-gratification, ambition and lust for power.

Jesus, may we be aware that the ultimate danger for our immortal souls is in wrongly identifying the source of our eternal happiness. May we know with certainty that our vocation as Christians is not to be looked up to and admired in the eyes of the world, but rather to be first in the eyes of God.



#### **Blessed Carlos Acutis**

Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian Catholic teenager, was beatified in Assisi, Italy on 10th October 2020. He documented Eucharistic miracles around the world and catalogued them all onto a website that he created himself in the months before his death from leukaemia. Carlo was known for his cheerfulness, his care for others, his computer skills and his deep devotion to the Eucharist, saying it was his "highway to heaven". There is a display in the Cathedral dedicated to Blessed Carlo Acutis and prayer cards which you are welcome to take.



The Prayer Garden, which is located behind the Grotto, names all the parishes of the Derry Diocese and includes prayers for those who died during the pandemic. Fifty-one rose plants have been planted to remember those who died from each parish in the diocese since March 2020 when there were restrictions on wakes and funerals. The Garden will not be officially dedicated until a later date, however, everyone is welcome to come and pray or reflect.





# Starting conversations in our parishes



"We have to look at where the Lord is leading us in order for us to be effective in making new disciples for the Lord"

Pope Francis is inviting the faithful all over the world to come with him "on a journey" as a "Synodal Church". The word 'synod' means "walking together" and "indicates a way of being together as Church and 'discerning' how best to spread the Gospel amidst the challenges of life in the 21st century."

This Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission* coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Bishop Donal explains this is the start of our Synodal Journey: "We have set ourselves in Ireland a five year period, to look together in a prayerful context where God is leading His Church"
