A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 6:7-13

Jesus has been rejected by his people in Nazareth on the grounds of his 'ordinariness' which, they argue, is in direct conflict with the wisdom and great learning he exhibits, rendering it suspicious in their eyes. Astonished and shocked by their ignorance and prejudice, Jesus leaves Nazareth and goes into the neighbouring villages of Galilee to continue his ministry of repentance and healing.

He sends out the Twelve to do his work, arming them with the authority to preach in his name, to heal and to banish unclean spirits: ordinary people, fishermen mainly, doing extraordinary things! Can the message be any clearer that it is the power of God, not worldly power, which renders us extraordinary! It is that we are all His sons and daughters, equal in His eyes, which enables us to do extraordinary things in His name. Jesus sends the Twelve out in pairs, an important act in its emphasis on communities, however tiny, rather than a single voice. He instructs them clearly and succinctly before they set off on how to conduct themselves while fulfilling the mission he has entrusted to them. They are to take nothing with them: they must depend totally on the hospitality of others for food and shelter, and if they are rejected by a village they are to shake the dust of that place off their shoes as they leave, thus making it clear that those who have refused God's message have nobody but themselves to blame.

The Twelve go out armed with nothing but the truth which, Jesus knows, is all they need.

The Twelve go out and by the manner of their going out extol the virtues of hospitality, community, sharing, and acceptance of the excluded.

May they bring the peace and healing power of the Lord to the people they will serve.
