## 20<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time A Short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 12:49-53

Many find today's Gospel, on a first reading, at least, confusing, disconcerting, even. Surely Jesus came on earth to bring people together in peace and love! Why then does he state in today's Gospel that he has come to bring division and conflict? His words, 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already!' are powerful and passionate. They are also frightening. But then we realise that the divisions Jesus talks about, the devastation, the conflicts, the warring households, have everything to do with humankind's willingness or otherwise to accept the full import of the Good News. Fire is associated with punishment and devastation, but it is also associated with purification, purgation. John baptised with water; Jesus baptised with fire.

Many of us find the unconditional love for each other and the 'seventy times seven' forgiveness for each other as taught by Jesus, to be at odds with our self-centred natures and we reject his teaching. Many of us hate any attempt to jolt us out of our complacency, or to disturb our determination to stay rooted in the way things have always been, so we turn our backs on the beauty of the Good News in order to hide our face from its challenges. Ironically, the Good News brought on earth by Jesus to unite us in love, becomes a source of division by our failure to embrace it with open, joyful, hearts.

Jesus, purify us in the fire of your love until we blaze with passionate ardour for the Good News. Purge us of our selfishness and illumine our lives with your truth, so that our hearts are open and unafraid to face and embrace its challenges.
