A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 8: 27-35

'Who do you say I am?' Jesus asks his disciples in today's Gospel, and Peter, his face probably alight with love, responds, 'You are the Christ.' And Peter is right: Jesus is the Christ. But Jesus knows that, as yet, neither Peter nor the rest of his disciples understand the full implications of his question: they are suffering a failure of understanding because they are thinking exclusively in human terms. When Peter objects to his beloved Master's insistence that he, Jesus, is destined to suffer grievously, Jesus rebukes him with the words: 'Get thee behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

If Jesus were to ask us today who we think he is, what would our answer be? Would our answer be, 'Jesus, you are God's active presence in our lives. You are unconditional love. You are the forgiveness which forgives over and over. You are the one who brought us the transforming, non-violent, loving message of the Gospels which we so often miss. In the agony of the Cross which you bore uncomplainingly, you taught us that to live lives which are ego-centred is not the way of God: but lives which have you at their centre light our way to eternal life.

Or, would our answer to Jesus' question, 'Who do you say I am?' be: 'You are whatever it suits me to believe you are!'

Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood – We pray for those whom Jesus is calling to serve Him and His Church as priests of the diocese of Derry, that they will have the courage to take up His invitation and follow Him, trusting that in losing their life for His sake they will discover a much richer life as His disciples, serving His people, embracing whatever challenges (crosses) priesthood may bring, but with faith and hope in Jesus as Lord and Saviour.
