# A short reflection on today's Gospel

In today's Gospel the parable Jesus recounts to the chief priests and the elders of the people uses the familiar Biblical image of the banquet to describe the kingdom of heaven. A king issues invitations to the feast he is giving for his son's wedding. His invitations are rudely rebuffed by his ignorant subjects, who are then sorely punished by the king for their graceless behaviour. The question posed by today's Gospel is this: 'Do we want to be a part of the wedding feast?' God issues an invitation to every one of us, an invitation to sit at His open table in fellowship with each other and partake of the meal He has prepared for us as the image of His unconditional love, of His grace. His gift is free. In a world organized into a meritocracy by humanity we find the abundance of God's grace difficult to understand. While we hold on to the mind set of deserving, of merit, of earning, buying, selling, we shall never be able to understand the beauty of God's grace. We shall never understand His invitation to the banquet. Jesus, help us to free ourselves from the sticking-place of our obsession with deserving and open ourselves to the beauty of God's grace. Jesus, your mother, Mary, full of grace, shows us the way in her humble acceptance of God's choice of her as the mother of His Son. Teach us to put on the wedding garment of a grateful heart – open to God's grace.
