Excerpt from Statement by the Catholic Bishops of Northern Ireland:

"As many people as possible stay at home for the sake of health, life and the Common Good"

"Faith and prayer can be a tremendous support to individuals and society during these difficult times"

In light of our ongoing consultations and of the current serious and worsening situation, and in line with clear public health guidance that people should *stay at home*, we have decided that for a limited period (from midnight on Thursday, 7th January until Saturday, 6th February 2021, subject to review in late January), the celebration of the Eucharist and other liturgies should take place without the physical presence of the faithful - with the exception of marriage, funeral, baptismal liturgies and drive-in services (subject to regulations). Arrangements for recording and/or livestreaming, and making individual visits for private prayer are also permissible in accordance with regulations. We encourage parishes, where possible, to continue to broadcast the celebration of Mass - and other devotions and prayer services - online and on other media, knowing that faith and prayer can be a tremendous support to individuals and society during these difficult times.

We make this decision reluctantly, conscious that not being able to gather for public worship can cause pain for all the faithful, but in the hope that this limited period of sacrifice will be for the protection of life and health and for the greater good of all. We once more ask for prayers for the sick, the bereaved and all those whose livelihoods have been particularly impacted by the pandemic. We keep in our prayers all health workers, carers, chaplains and other essential workers. We welcome the announcement that a similar position is being taken by the leaders of the Church of Ireland, the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, the Methodist Church in Ireland and many other denominations and faith communities in response to the unequivocal message from public health authorities that as many people as possible stay at home at this time.



Reflection on today's Gospel: John 1: 35-42

'We have found the Messiah'

Today's Gospel holds two examples of looks exchanged between individuals which are laden with significance. The first is the long intense look John the Baptist gives to the newly-arrived Jesus, which prefaces his announcement that the promised Messiah has come at last. What John experiences here is the joy of recognition towards which his life, his ministry, has been leading. His work is done. His mission has been accomplished. He has humbly and powerfully prepared the way for the Lord and now the Lord is here.

The second significant look in today's Gospel is the deep searching look Jesus bestows on Simon before renaming him Peter, his rock. We can conclude that Jesus, looking deeply into Peter's face, can see his human weaknesses as well as his passionate goodness; his future betrayals as well as his heart-felt remorse. He can see that this simple fisherman will go from strength to strength because of his acknowledgement of his sins, his profound repentance, and his humble seeking of forgiveness. He will be, Jesus knows, the worthy rock on which to build his church.

Earlier, when Jesus sees John's apostles following him, he asks them what it is they want, what it is they are searching for. When they respond that they wish to see where he lives, he invites them to 'come and see'.

Jesus, teach us to look deeply into your beautiful, compassionate face and recognise in it the truth of our salvation.

Jesus, may we always be aware that what we want is you; that it is you we are always searching for. May we listen with our hearts to your invitation to 'come and see' where you live, and abide in that place with you forever.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18th to 25th January: The Annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Monday,18th January and lasts until Monday, 25th January. The theme this year is "Abide in my love and you shall bear much fruit", based on John 15:1-17. The resources for this year have been provided by the Monastic Community of Grandchamp in Switzerland. Obviously, the Covid-19 pandemic has limited our options for marking this week in 2021 but we are encouraged to pray together in our homes and, if possible, via online means. 
