A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 10:35-45

As human beings most of us would define the ultimate in success as a jubilant climb to the top of our chosen ladder. The desire of many is to negotiate an intimate friendship with the world of power, the world of prestige and possessions. But the opposite is the essence of Jesus' teaching. According to Jesus, for us to achieve eternal life we must turn our backs on the world's definition of power and might and adopt instead a way of life which is modelled on his: a life dedicated to serving the needs of others. Jesus presents us with an entirely new model of power and leadership, which, if we are faithful to it, has every chance of creating a world of lasting peace and justice.

Today's Gospel witnesses James and John, sons of Zebedee, seeking primacy of place with Jesus as they excitedly envisage his establishment of a powerful kingdom on earth. They have failed completely to understand Jesus' words, and we can only imagine his sadness as they apply worldly standards of power and might to the things of heaven. Later, he presents to his disciples a clear image of true leadership: the way up to eternal life is the way down in humble dedication to serving the needs of others.

Jesus, may we find the courage and humility to withstand the seductiveness of worldly power and prestige and walk instead in the footsteps of Jesus who sacrificed his life so that we might live. May we use whatever God-given talents and gifts we possess in serving the needs of others.

Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood – As we celebrate Mission Sunday we pray for those who hope to play their part in the Church's mission of spreading the Good News of God's love as future priests of the diocese of Derry.

As the pilgrims of St Eugene's Parish begin their pilgrimage to Fatima this weekend, we ask that they keep us in their prayers. We pray that God remains with them on this holy pilgrimage, and may He guide their way in accord with His will. We ask that He shelters them with His protection by day, give them the light of His grace by night, and, as their companion on the journey, bring them to their destination in safety.

O Most Holy Virgin Mary, Queen of the most holy Rosary, you were pleased to appear to the children of Fatima and reveal a glorious message. We implore you, inspire in our hearts a fervent love for the recitation of the Rosary. By meditating on the mysteries of the redemption that are recalled therein may we obtain the graces and virtues that we ask, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer. Amen.
