Reflection on today's Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46

"I was naked and you clothed me; sick and you visited me."

Today's Gospel reminds us forcibly that our actions have eternal significance; that what we do in this life matters. It tells us that if we fail to see the face of Christ in the faces of the poor, the sick and the suffering, we are effectively turning our backs on God's invitation to eternal life. If we fail to reach out to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, house the homeless, comfort the grieving, then our protestations of devotion to God are just empty words. Time and time again, Jesus reminds us that the road to his heavenly Father is founded only in love, and in today's Gospel he reminds us that love has its real meaning in actions. It is comparatively easy to talk about, to write about, the suffering of humankind and even to feel a degree of self-satisfaction and self-righteousness in so doing; it is much more difficult and much more challenging to do something active about that suffering: to reach with generosity into one's pockets and give to the hungry; to give time and care to those crying out in wretchedness and loneliness; to visit the sick and comfort the grieving. If we do not see the face of the suffering, tortured, humiliated Christ in our fellow human beings and respond with active, passionate love, we are empty vessels, making empty sounds. When we act in love we make contact with our deepest identities: we are at one with God and the bright, perfect light of true faith which resides in our souls.

Funerals: The announcement by the Northern Ireland Executive, arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, restricts attendance at funerals to only 25 people. In order to adhere to this regulation, funerals will be celebrated at either 9.00 am or 11.00 am Monday to Saturday. Unfortunately, there will be no funeral Masses celebrated on a Sunday.



Face Coverings: We ask all adults and children aged 14 and over to please wear a face covering at Masses and other liturgical celebrations ie Funerals, Baptisms, First Communion, Weddings (unless they are exempt from wearing mandatory face coverings). Medical advice is that wearing face coverings is first and foremost about protecting others.

Please continue to observe social distancing, to use the hand sanitiser on entering and leaving the Cathedral.

Remembering Our Dead

‘By virtue of the communion of saints, the Church commends the dead to God’s mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist on their behalf’. This is how the catechism reminds us of our need to pray for the dead throughout the year but we remember them in a special way during the month of November.

This has been a very difficult year especially for those who have had so many restrictions on family funerals.

As we wait for the time when we can come together as a parish community for Mass, we have created a sacred space at Our Lady’s Altar.

At all Masses throughout November we will pray for the deceased family and friends of each home in our parish especially those who died during the past year and who are remembered at Our Lady’s Altar.

There is a box at Our Lady’s Altar for you to put the names of your deceased family and friends so that they can be remembered at all Masses during November.

Bishop McKeown will celebrate Mass and lead the Rosary each Friday during November for the deceased family and friends of each home in the Diocese especially those who died during the past year. Decree extends indulgence for the faithful departed throughout November

The Apostolic Penitentiary announces modifications to the Plenary Indulgence for the deceased during the month of November.

Many of the Church's pastors have requested an adaptation to the requirements to obtain the Plenary Indulgence for the deceased in the month of November. Thus, "by the special mandate of His Holiness Pope Francis", the Apostolic Penitentiary released on Friday some changes to the normal practice. The Decree containing these modifications was signed on 22nd October, the liturgical memorial of Pope St John Paul II.

Plenary Indulgence during month of November

Due to the coronavirus pandemic and the need to avoid large groups from forming where prohibited, the Plenary Indulgence applicable to the deceased by those who visit a cemetery has been extended beyond the normal dates of 1st to 8th November. This year, the indulgence can be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, on any day in November, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed.

Plenary Indulgence for Feast of All Souls' Day

Regarding the Plenary Indulgence attached to All Souls' Day, 2nd November, this year, it can be obtained not only on the preceding or succeeding Sunday, or on the actual Feast day, but on any other day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case, the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with the recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the other requirements associated with a Plenary Indulgence.

The homebound

For anyone who cannot leave their home for various reasons, including anti-Covid restrictions, they too can obtain the Plenary Indulgence by "uniting themselves spiritually to other members of the faithful". In this case, the condition of being "completely detached from sin" and the intention of completing the other requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence remain. These conditions are Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.

The Decree suggests that such prayer take place before an "image of Jesus or the Blessed Virgin Mary". Among the various prayers that are recommended are "prayers for the deceased, Morning or Evening Prayer from the Office of the Dead, the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, meditating on various Gospel passages proposed for the liturgy of the Dead, or completing a work of mercy by offering to God the suffering and discomforts of one's own life".
