

A short reflection on today's Gospel: Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21

'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'

Today's Gospel witnesses Jesus early on in his ministry exhibiting extraordinary power and eloquence as he teaches in the synagogue in Nazareth, his home town. The people are wonderstruck by his words, by the vastness and depth of his knowledge. They will later question his authority suspiciously on the grounds that 'he is merely Jesus, the son of Joseph, the carpenter', but now they are listening in awe as he reveals the mission entrusted to him by his heavenly Father. It is a mission of forgiveness, compassion, liberation; it is a mission of extraordinary beauty. The 'good news' of Jesus' mission on earth for those whose hearts and minds are open to its truth is salvation and eternal life. The spiritually blind will see with the clear eyes of faith in a loving God; those imprisoned in doubt and despair will be set free, liberated into the fresh green pastures of God's vision for humanity; those impoverished by injustice and misery will be restored and replenished:

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me,

for he has anointed me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor,

to proclaim liberty to captives

and to the blind new sight,

to set the downtrodden free,

to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

Jesus, may we always keep your words safely in our hearts, loving the beauty and glory of your heavenly Father's vision for us. May we see with the eyes of truth and surrender to that truth.





Starting conversations in our parishes



"We have to look at where the Lord is leading us in order for us to be effective in making new disciples for the Lord"

Pope Francis is inviting the faithful all over the world to come with him "on a journey" as a "Synodal Church". The word 'synod' means "walking together" and "indicates a way of being together as Church and 'discerning' how best to spread the Gospel amidst the challenges of life in the 21st century."

This Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission* coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Bishop Donal explains this is the start of our Synodal Journey: "We have set ourselves in Ireland a five year period, to look together in a prayerful context where God is leading His Church"
