30th Sunday in Ordinary Time A Short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 18:9-14

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Luke 18:9-14

Today's Gospel is clear and succinct in its message: those who trumpet their virtuousness and righteousness to God and who see themselves as vastly superior to others, do not incur the favour of the Almighty, while those who humbly acknowledge their sinfulness 'go home justified'.

In the parable Jesus relates the Pharisee proudly recites what he regards as proof of his Godly superiority: a rigid adherence to the law. In doing so, he also makes it clear that he despises others for their failure to be as law-abiding as he is.

The tax collector, on the other hand, exhibits only humility as he confesses his sinfulness. He 'would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.' The tax collector unwittingly, perhaps, prays a most beautiful prayer, a prayer pregnant with truth, humility, and repentance.

The Pharisee does not see himself as a soul in need of salvation. In his conviction that he is perfect, one can only imagine the outrage he would exhibit at the teachings of Jesus which would condemn his pride and arrogance. The tax collector, on the other hand, we can imagine falling at the feet of Jesus and taking into himself Jesus' ministry of faith, love and repentance.

Jesus, may we never forget the prayer uttered by the humble tax collector, and may it become our prayer too. May we never allow ourselves to become consumed by false notions of our own virtuousness leading to contempt for others; rather let us be conscious always of our need for repentance and forgiveness.
