Reflection on today's Gospel: Matthew: 22: 34-40

"On these two commandments hang the whole Law"

Today's short Gospel is crystal clear in terms of all we need to know if we are to gain eternal life: love God above all else and love one's neighbour as oneself. Love is the beginning and end of everything. We can only know God through love. To profess love for God while hating one's neighbour renders that profession of love for God null and void. Loving one's neighbour, who is all humankind, means withholding judgement; exercising forgiveness, understanding, compassion and generosity to others. It means living lives which are exclusively love-centred. It means liberating ourselves from a state of compulsive servitude to this world and living out God's dream for each and every one of us.

However, we are imperfect beings: we can be egocentric, judgemental, hungry for power and control, in thrall to the world and its lures, and, as such, we fail over and over again to live love-centred lives. We despair and give up. It's too much for us. We can never succeed. Well, we can never succeed on our own, that's true. We are totally reliant on the love, mercy and grace of God which is ours for the asking. This is what is meant by the words of Jesus: "God in us; we in God." When we truly place God at the centre of our lives and open ourselves to his compassionate love, we can feel that powerful love flowing through us, through us and out to the whole of humankind; poor, suffering often misguided humankind, ourselves; and only then shall we recognise the truth that the goal of all religion is to lead us back to the place where everything is one.

Blessed of Carlos Acutis

Carlo Acutis was beatified in Assisi, Italy on Saturday, 10th October 2020. Carlo was an Italian Catholic teenager. He documented Eucharistic miracles around the world and catalogued them all onto a website that he created himself in the months before his death from leukaemia. Carlo was known for his cheerfulness, his care for others, his computer skills and his deep devotion to the Eucharist, saying it was his "highway to heaven". There is a display in the Cathedral dedicated to Carlo and prayer cards which you are welcome to take.

Funerals: The recent announcement by the Northern Ireland Executive, arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, restricts attendance at funerals to only 25 people. In order to adhere to this regulation, funerals will be celebrated at either 9.00 am or 11.00 am Monday to Saturday. Unfortunately there will be no funeral Masses celebrated on a Sunday.



Face Coverings: We encourage all adults and children aged 14 and over to please wear a face covering at Masses and other liturgical celebrations ie Funerals, Baptisms, First Communion, Weddings (unless they are exempt from wearing face coverings, even in situations which would otherwise be mandatory).
