Reflection on today's Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

John: a pattern of true righteousness.

At the heart of today's Gospel lies the rugged spirit of John the Baptist, uncompromisingly honest, humble, his back resolutely turned to the world's seats of power and privilege, passionately preaching his message of repentance and salvation. John's spirit is completely without guile, without deception: profundity, passion and truth define him. His is the' pattern of righteousness' honoured by Jesus.

Of the two sons in the parable taught by Jesus in today's Gospel, the son who initially refuses to work in his father's vineyard but who subsequently repents his lack of filial respect, is the one regarded as worthy of approval. The son who agrees to his father's request to work in the vineyard without any intention of doing so, comes off badly as glib and untrustworthy.

To be a true disciple of Jesus then we must be open to the light of his ministry as John was, humble enough to repent of our sinfulness, willing to live our lives in the spirit of truth and passionate in our commitment to that truth.
