A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 10:46-52

In today's Gospel, Bartimaeus, the blind beggar, throws off his cloak and runs, full of faith, to Jesus to be healed. His cloak is an emblem of his helplessness, of his suffering and misery; it is something to hide behind, something which offers some kind of shelter and warmth. By throwing it off, Bartimaeus demonstrates his complete faith that Jesus will heal him, and indeed it is his faith which Jesus affirms has restored his sight. 'Go; your faith has saved you.'

The cure of Bartimaeus begs the question: 'What will Bartimaeus do with his new-found sight?' Will he forever follow in the footsteps of Jesus, clear-eyed and trusting, living out his life according to the truth revealed to him?

And the cure of Bartimaeus begs the question of the rest of us: What do we do with the sight gifted to us by God? The word 'respect' means 'seeing again'; in other words, seeing more deeply than first sight. Jesus always saw deeply into people. He saw beyond the superficial, the readily available, into the truth which resided in their hearts. He saw the beautiful truth which lived in the heart of the woman who washed his feet with her tears and dried them with her hair, while the Pharisee only saw her doubtful status as a woman of ill repute.

Jesus, may we see your beautiful face in the most demoralised of human beings? Jesus, may we see beyond the evil which men do to the brokenness, the love gone sick, of the evildoer?

Jesus, may we always 'look again'. May we seek to see beyond the superficial, the readily available, to the deeper meanings in the lives of others, just as you taught us to do.
