A Short Reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 24:37-44

"You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

A superficial reading of today's Gospel might easily interpret it as threatening it can induce the fear that if we do not watch out for God's coming, we can be caught 'on the hop', as it were, and incur His everlasting displeasure. But God is always with us; He is always present in our lives. It is we who are not always present to God. When Jesus told us that he had come to give us life and give it to the full, he meant us to ponder his words deeply. Living life to the full means being alive to the presence of God in every moment we breathe; it means being fully awake, fully alert to how we are living our God-given lives. It means seeing God's plan for us in all our experiences, joyful and sorrowful. It means we can never accuse God of not listening to us; we can only accuse ourselves of not listening to God.
