22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time A Short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 14:1, 7-14

Humility is the theme of today's Gospel. Jesus knew that without humility, we cannot grow. He knew that we need to work constantly against the workings of our egos which cling to the notion of certitudes, and which crave power and control over people and events in the mistaken notion that such control will somehow protect us from whatever it is we dread. In what amounts to a parable in today's Gospel, Jesus strongly advises us to choose humility rather than arrogance. The hierarchies we slavishly cling to are not of God's choosing. They are of humankind's choosing in the interests of power and control and in the absence of humility. True humility recognises that clinging to the certitudes we've invented is all wrong because such clinging blocks spiritual growth. True humility knows and accepts the limitations of human knowledge and understanding. True humility knows that in the coming together of heaven and earth in the Eucharist God is the host, and God is about inclusivity. God is about an embrace wide enough to include and welcome to the altar the poor, the unwashed, the sick, the addicted, and all those others rejected by the arrogant. True humility opens the door to compassion, to doubt, to uncertainty. True humility seeks rest in the embrace of Christ, in faith, in hope and in love, knowing that 'all shall be well, all shall be well, and all manner of things shall be well'.
