Season of Advent: 28th November to 24th December St Eugene's Cathedral - Advent Programme:

Monday to Friday: Morning Prayer of the Church will be prayed at 7.45 am beginning tomorrow (Monday, 29th November).

Monday to Friday: Mass will be celebrated at <u>5.15 pm</u> during Advent beginning tomorrow (Monday, 29th November).

The 5.15 pm Mass each Thursday during Advent will be a Rorate Mass. The Rorate Mass has a long tradition in the Church. The name comes from the opening words of the Entrance Antiphon, *Rorate cæli desuper*, Latin for "Drop down dew, ye heavens". This is a Votive Mass in honour of Our Lady for the season of Advent, celebrated by candlelight early in the morning or in the evening. Our Lady shows herself in a special way as our leader through Advent to Christmas. The Mass begins in darkness – candles will be provided. The Cathedral lights will be switched on when the Glory in sung.

Late Opening on Mondays – 29th November, 6th, 13th and 20th December: To celebrate the sacrament of Confession and spend some quiet time in the presence of the Eucharist from 8.30 pm to 10.00 pm.

Lectio Divina every Tuesday during Advent: – Fr Ignacy invites you to join him for reflections of the Sunday scripture readings from 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm in the Cathedral Hall beginning on Tuesday, 30th November.



The booklet can be viewed on a computer, tablet or mobile. It can also be printed at home.



A short reflection on today's Gospel. Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

That day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap.

In today's Gospel according to Luke, Jesus lists the signs which will herald the end of the world. 'That day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap,' Jesus warns us. He warns us to watch, to stay awake. It is significant that the Church begins the new liturgical year with a Gospel reading which describes the calamitous ending of the world. Endings, we should remember, are often the birthing places of new beginnings. The ending described in today's Gospel promises, according to Jesus himself, the beginning of a new world of eternal bliss for all who are faithful to his truth. But if we are to share in his Father's world of eternal bliss we must listen to Jesus and follow his teachings; we must walk to Calvary with him; we must carry his cross and suffer with him; we must die to this world with him; and none of this can happen if we do not stay awake, always awake and alert to the world's attempts to distract us from God's perfect plan for us.

We are created by God for love. Our souls yearn to be united with the perfect Love which breathed life into us. There is no rest for us until we rest in that perfect Love. Distracted by this world, we think we need material proof for everything that exists, but in truth, it is the promise of eternity to which our souls respond; it has been said that it is dreams which drive us and it is hopes which make things happen. It is the mystery which calls to us. God knows us better than we know ourselves, and in the purity of His knowledge of us he draws us to him by His promise of eternity, by the ineffable mystery of His being and by His presence, pregnant with silence, deep in our contemplative souls.

Jesus, may we waste no time but be forever vigilant, forever alert, forever faithful to your truth, so that when you finally come for us we are ready for you to gather us in your arms and wrap us in the warm cloak of your love. Amen

Remembering Our Dead



'By virtue of the communion of saints, the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist on their behalf'. This is how the catechism reminds us of our need to pray for the dead throughout the year but we remember them in a special way during the month of November.

As we wait for the time when we can come together without restrictions as a parish community for Mass, we have the names of those who died during the past year (23rd October 2020 to 27th October 2021) displayed at the sacred space at Our Lady's Altar.

At all Masses throughout November we will pray for the deceased family and friends of each home in our parish especially those who died during the past year and who are remembered at Our Lady's Altar.

There is also a basket at Our Lady's Altar to put the names of your deceased family and friends so that they can be remembered at all Masses during November.

Family prayer at home – 'November A Month To Remember' – This booklet contains prayers for November, a family prayer service for use at home and information about a remembrance event at Knock Shrine. This booklet may be of particular interest to families and those who are housebound. The Prayer Garden, which is located behind the Grotto, has now been completed. The Prayer Garden names all the parishes of the Derry Diocese and includes prayers for those who died during the pandemic. Fifty-one rose plants have been planted to remember those who died from each parish in the diocese since March 2020 when there were restrictions on wakes and funerals. The Garden will not be officially dedicated until a later date, however, everyone is welcome to come and pray or reflect.

Cathedral Voices is for people living with dementia and their families, friends and carers. This is a pilot programme which we are delivering here in St Eugene's Cathedral led by Margarette McNamee. It is a time to come and listen to music, have a cup of tea and a chat.


Blessed Carlos Acutis

Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian Catholic teenager, was beatified in Assisi, Italy on 10th October 2020. He documented Eucharistic miracles around the world and catalogued them all onto a website that he created himself in the months before his death from leukaemia. Carlo was known for his cheerfulness, his care for others, his computer skills and his deep devotion to the Eucharist, saying it was his "highway to heaven". There is a display in the Cathedral dedicated to Blessed Carlo Acutis and prayer cards which you are welcome to take.

Pope Francis is inviting the faithful all over the world to come with him "on a journey" as a "Synodal Church". The word 'synod' means "walking together" and "indicates a way of being together as Church and 'discerning' how best to spread the Gospel amidst the challenges of life in the 21st century."

This Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission* coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Bishop Donal explains this is the start of our Synodal Journey: "We have set ourselves in Ireland a five year period, to look together in a prayerful context where God is leading His Church"

In this video, <u>https://youtu.be/Lhky65OFfEQ</u>, Bishop Donal McKeown reminds us of the purpose of the Church and outlines the prayerful consultation process of Synodality, of walking together, of listening, of being led by the Holy Spirit to understand where the Lord is leading us.
