# A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Once again through Scripture we can bear witness to Jesus as a powerful teacher and an exemplar of a life being lived out with uncompromising truth and fidelity to the will of his heavenly Father. In today's Gospel John tells Jesus that he has tried to stop people from performing miracles in Jesus' name because they were not, as John puts it, 'one of us'! Jesus' response to his disciple teaches us the dangers of harbouring notions of exclusivity, of separating ourselves from others on the grounds that they don't merit somehow to be included in our 'inner circle'. Jesus once again insists that it is what lies in the heart which is important, not whether one is 'in' or 'out'...

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us to be aware of the things we harbour in our lives which cause us to sin; sins we must remove if we are to enter into eternal life. Again he uses the image of the child as a symbol of innocence and trusting faith, and he warns anyone who would seek to destroy that innocence and faith that it would be better for that person 'to be thrown into the sea with a great millstone around his neck'.

Jesus, may we seek to be transformed in our lives by your word and your actions. May we strive to remove from our lives all that causes us to sin so that we can enter into the eternal life promised to all who walk with you.

Jesus, may we turn our backs, as you did, on notions of elitism and exclusivity, as well as on narcissism and coldness of heart. May we reach out always to those in need of our support, understanding and love, and may we do this in your name. Amen.
