

A short reflection on today's Gospel: Luke 4:21-30

No prophet is ever accepted in his own country

Jesus has revealed both his identity and his mission on earth to his fellow Nazarenes: he has told them that he is the long- awaited-for Messiah prophesied by Isaiah and that he has come to bring the Good News to the poor, the blind, the imprisoned and the oppressed. He has shattered the old image of God as a harsh and vengeful judge and has revealed Him instead to be a compassionate and loving father who welcomes with open arms all those who have previously been unjustly excluded from His favour by those who believed in their own exclusivity and guarded it fiercely. And many indeed suffered exclusion: women, children, foreigners, lepers, Samaritans, the maimed and the mutilated – to name but some.

The Nazarenes listening to Jesus' words in the synagogue were initially filled with awe and amazement but this soon turned to outrage, and even to murderous intent, as Jesus made his all-inclusiveness clear. They bitterly resented his insistence that all were welcome to reach for the Kingdom of God. They hated his assertion that God's mercy, love and compassion extended to groups of people they despised and had always treated with contempt. Jesus was not telling them what they wanted to hear: he was not confirming their prejudices, underlining their convictions and so they were ready to destroy him rather than listen with hearts made humble by the truth.

Jesus, may we examine our lives daily and open ourselves to the ways in which we exclude others.

Jesus, may we excise from our lives our notions of exclusivity, hierarchy, separateness from others, and embrace God's directive to treat all others with respect, understanding and love. May we demolish the walls we erect to keep others out lest, instead, we imprison ourselves in darkness behind those same walls.





## Starting conversations in our parishes



"We have to look at where the Lord is leading us in order for us to be effective in making new disciples for the Lord"

Pope Francis is inviting the faithful all over the world to come with him "on a journey" as a "Synodal Church". The word 'synod' means "walking together" and "indicates a way of being together as Church and 'discerning' how best to spread the Gospel amidst the challenges of life in the 21st century."

This Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission* coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Bishop Donal explains this is the start of our Synodal Journey: "We have set ourselves in Ireland a five year period, to look together in a prayerful context where God is leading His Church"
