A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 5:21-43

Today's Gospel illuminates important truths about Jesus. One such truth offers us the beautiful consolation that he cares deeply about suffering in the world, so deeply that, far from subscribing to the prejudicial law which would have rendered the woman with the issue of blood unclean, he reaches out to her in kindness, generosity and admiration. He sees into the truth of the woman: her suffering, her courage which is greater than her natural timidity, her humility and, above all, her powerful faith. And her powerful faith brings us to another truth of Jesus illuminated by today's Gospel: if our faith is real, then that faith in itself is sufficient to bring about our own healing. The woman's undiluted faith meant that, in effect, she brought about her own healing. Jesus states this truth clearly:

'My daughter,' he said, 'your faith has restored you to health; go in peace and be free of your complaint.'

One cannot help but effect a contrast between the woman's faith and the lack of faith exhibited by Jesus terrified' disciples when the storm raged around their boat while Jesus slept serenely in the stern.

The healing of the woman happens between Jairus' plea to Jesus to come and save his young daughter who is dangerously ill, and the actual raising of the child from the dead by Jesus. Before they set off for the house of Jairus, word comes to them that the little girl has died. One can only imagine the grief, the heartbreak, of the child's father. Once again Jesus reaches out with pity and love in his response to human suffering. He tells the stricken father to have faith, to trust, and all shall be well. Faith and trust in Jesus prevail and the little girl is restored to life.

Jesus, teach us to surrender ourselves completely to you, trusting in your love for suffering humanity to see us through our trials and to heal our wounds.

Jesus, may our faith in you be as strong as that of the woman in today's Gospel; may it be as trusting as that of the grief-stricken Jairus. May we know that only in total faith and trust in you shall we find the healing we weep for.
