## A short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 2:22-40

Today's Gospel witnesses the rewards of a steadfast faith and lives lived in willing service to God. It tells the story of the upright Simeon and Anna who patiently await the birth of the promised child who would be the 'light to enlighten the pagans, and the glory of God's people Israel.'

Now Simeon had been promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. He had been prompted by that same Holy Spirit to come to the Temple that day, and when he laid eyes on the child, Jesus, who was being presented by his parents in accordance with Jewish law, he took him into his arms, blessed God and exclaimed: 'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised, because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see.' The waiting was over. The Son of God was in the world, never to leave. Simeon can rest in peace and Anna can proclaim the Good News to all who listen. God's infinite love for us has borne beautiful fruit in the shape of a tiny vulnerable child, a child who will one day willingly sacrifice his life for our salvation.


