The annual Little Way Novena in honour of St Thérèse of Lisieux will be take place at St Eugene's Cathedral from Saturday 10th May until Sunday 18th May 2025. This will be an opportunity to pray for a special intention and to ask St Thérèse to intercede for us. It is a time when many people find great joy and healing. All are very welcome.

The Novena begins with a Mass with the Anointing of the sick at 7.30pm on Saturday 10^{th} May.

The Opening Ceremony will take place at 6.00pm on Sunday 11th May with Bishop Donal McKeown.

Saturday (17th) the 10.00am Mass will be celebrated for all those who have died.

The Novena Closing Ceremony will take place on Sunday 18th May at 3.00pm with the blessing of roses and candles.

A short reflection on today's Gospel John 21:1-19

Today's Gospel, which describes the disciples' third encounter with the risen Jesus, is a beautiful, moving and tender testament to divine love: through his generosity, kindness and forgiveness, Jesus frees his beloved disciples from their confusion and doubt into embracing the change of direction their lives must now take. In their fear and uncertainty, they have returned to Galilee and to the life they knew before they'd met and followed Jesus. But Jesus wants these fishermen to become fishers of souls. The risen Jesus' third encounter with his disciples is to show them the impossibility of returning to the past.

Today's Gospel also grants us an insight into the anguished mind of Simon Peter. He has betrayed his beloved master three times, and that betrayal is torturing him. But he has reckoned without the full extent of Jesus' love and understanding. Jesus knows Peter's passionate, loving heart, and he understands the human fear which held him back from doing the courageous thing. He now offers that knowledge and understanding to Peter as a gift. He asks Peter if he loves him three times, the same number of times Peter had denied him. Of course he knows that Peter loves him, and he now soothes his friend's anguished heart by entrusting him with the task of saving his people: of feeding his lambs and his sheep. Jesus, may we be kind, generous and forgiving towards others as you have taught us to be.

Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood: Jesus invites His disciples to listen to His advice and to spend time in His company. We pray that the men considering a vocation to the diocesan priesthood will be inspired and encouraged through their prayer, meditation, and reading of the Scriptures.

First Holy Communion – Congratulations to the boys and girls from Rosemount Primary School who celebrated their First Holy Communion here at St Eugene's Cathedral during the week. May this special day be their first step in a life-long love of the Eucharist.
