A short reflection on today's Gospel John 8:1-11

Today's Gospel makes it clear that Jesus did not come among us to please us; he did not come among us to flatter or curry favour with the rich and the powerful; he did not come among us to nod his approval of those who would separate us out into the deserving and the undeserving: the saints and the sinners. Jesus came among us to unsettle us, to challenge our notions of justice and judgement. He came among us to teach us God's ways and to banish those ways of man which so often masquerade as God's ways but are designed to serve our notions of exclusivity and separateness; our notions of 'us and them!'

The Scribes and the Pharisees, always on the alert to trap Jesus who had fearlessly and on many occasions undermined their authority and their probity, haul an adulteress in front of him and challenge him to dispute the law of Moses which holds that the woman merits being stoned to death for her actions. Jesus' response is to kneel on the ground and begin writing in the sand. When the Scribes and Pharisees persist, he looks up and says: 'Let the one among you who has not sinned be the first to throw a stone.' And he continues to write in the sand. We never learn what it is that Jesus is writing. Perhaps it is the sins of the Scribes and Pharisees, as has been suggested by some scholars. Starting with the eldest, the woman's accusers all slink away leaving her standing before Jesus, who, while not approving of her sin, offers no condemnation but instead offers her compassion and forgiveness. Surely Jesus' quiet forgiveness, his saving of her life, must have had a transformative effect on the life she lived afterwards.

Jesus, may we avoid any semblance of smugness and self-righteousness in our lives. May our minds and hearts always be focused on unity rather than separation, recognising that our brothers and sisters are all of mankind. May humility and truth be the light which guides us towards eternity.
