A short reflection on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time by the Columba Community

The readings speak to us today about MISSION as Jesus sends out the 72 disciples. He sends them out with clear instructions about what they are to do. They are to bring the greeting of peace, cure those who are sick and tell the people that the Kingdom of God is very near. There is an urgency in the mission he gives them because he sees that the harvest is plentiful. There are so many people who need to hear this good news of peace and healing.

When the disciples return rejoicing Jesus focuses not on what they have done but how they have grown in their relationship with God "your names are written in heaven."

We are all called to this mission of bringing peace and healing in the situations of our lives, proclaiming the good news of God's love. Sometimes we put obstacles in our way instead of accepting the invitation to be missionaries. Have you ever said...I couldn't do that/I could not be used by God/I'm not good enough? At these times we are putting the focus on us rather than on God who takes the initiative and who will always give us what we need to carry out the task that he gives us.

The desire in the heart of God is that we have a deep and loving relationship with Him. This relationship is nurtured in private prayer, in the sacraments and in the works of service He leads us into.

Our life situations may not be ideal, but God will always use the willing, open heart as a channel of His love for others.

Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood: In the gospel Jesus invites us to "...ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into His harvest..." because "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few." As we thank God for our seminarians and the men currently discerning a vocation, we pray that many more will hear, and respond positively, to the Lord's call to serve the Church as priests of the diocese.
