## A short Gospel reflection Luke 14:25-33

Today's Gospel according to Luke is both proactive and seriously challenging, leaving us in no doubt about the difficulties of discipleship. If the life we lead isn't the life Jesus taught us to live, then we cannot call ourselves his disciples. If God does not have primacy in our lives, if we do not put God before all earthly ties and needs, then we are not his true followers. We may profess our commitment to Jesus as our Saviour but if the lives we live are steeped in selfish pursuits, if we turn a blind eye to the suffering and needs of others, and a deaf ear to the anguished weeping of children, then our professions of undying faith mean nothing.

Jesus is facing his road to Calvary. He will be reviled, goaded and humiliated. He will be betrayed and abandoned by those he loves. He will be tormented and tortured before being nailed to a cross between two criminals. This is the road we must travel with Jesus, carrying our own cross with the same never-failing love and compassion in our hearts, the same forgiveness of all others on our lips. It's a hard road but it's the only road which leads to true discipleship and to God

**Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood**: We pray for the men called to serve as priests of the diocese, that they'll have what Jesus asks in the gospel this weekend - detachment from worldly possessions and courage to take up whatever cross or crosses come with priestly ministry.
