A short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 4:1-13

Today's Gospel is powerful in the teaching it offers us as we witness the assault on Jesus by Satan. Jesus is subject to every human experience from birth to death. Otherwise, the incarnation is incomplete and his ministry is defective. As our Saviour he must share in our everyday temptations, and he does. The conflict in today's Gospel is between the kingdom of God and the kingdom of this world. And it's no coincidence that Jesus' temptation immediately follows his baptism. It is acknowledged that when conversion or transformation or some profound spiritual experience occurs, when a certain level of wisdom, maturity has been reached, then it is that we are hit with temptations more strongly than ever. But it is through times of trial and temptation that we grow in spiritual wisdom. In the Gospel today, Jesus teaches us how to withstand assaults on our souls by the master of lies and deception. All three of Satan's temptations have the misuse of power at their centre: power without spiritual wisdom. Jesus calmly refutes each of Satan's temptations by countering them with the words of his Father in heaven. Satan attempts to seduce Jesus with promises of earthly power and status but the eyes of Jesus are firmly fixed on the things of God. Satan proves impotent in the face of the steadfastness of Jesus, and therein lies the lesson in today's Gospel.

Jesus, may we, like you, be willing at times to draw apart from the world to pray and thereby to strengthen and purify our fidelity to God and to the task with which He has entrusted us: to proclaim His kingdom.
