

A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 18:15-20

If your brother listens to you, you have won back your brother

What is at the heart of Jesus' words in today's Gospel is love, love which is informed by respect for the dignity of God's creation and the genuine will to rehabilitate the offender rather than dish out immediate judgement and punishment. The way to resolve conflict recommended by Jesus, is the honourable way. It is the way of truth and love, with its readiness to forgive and forget. It is the way which seeks to rehabilitate the errant brother back into the fold. It is not the way which descends into an avoidance of direct confrontation and indulges instead in the kind of cruel gossip which is murderous to human dignity.

If the wrongdoer refuses to listen to one or more of his brothers or sisters and persists in his wrongdoing, then he will have effectively excluded himself from his community. But even then, he may not be lost, because there is still the overflowing magnitude of God's mercy, God's super abundant wealth of forgiveness and love at the sinner's disposal.

Jesus, may we be open to your teaching in today's Gospel and always take the honourable way to resolve conflict: the way of openness, truth, and respect for the dignity of God's creation.

Jesus, instead of taking the way of Jesus to resolve conflict, may we never resort to the cowardly way of cruel gossip about those with whom we are in disagreement. It may be the easy, immediate way towards satisfaction, but it is always the soul-destroying way – for both victim and perpetrator.
