A short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

'I am baptizing you with water but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.' John the Baptist's passionate allegiance to the ministry entrusted to him by God and made manifest in the powerful eloquence of his preaching, convinces many of his followers that he is the promised Messiah. John's response to their assumption is beautiful in its clarity, its truth, and its humility. It prepares his followers for the greatness which is to come in the person of Jesus, the true Messiah, the Son of God and the Saviour of humankind, the One who will baptize, not with water, but with the Holy Spirit and with Fire.

There follows the baptism of Jesus by John on Jesus' own insistence.

Jesus, the sinless one, insists on being baptised by John and by doing so, becomes one with the kingdom of God on earth. He becomes one with humankind in this as in everything else: suffering, grief, terror, loneliness, rejection, death. And his heavenly Father lovingly and dramatically acknowledges His Son's courage.

Jesus, we kneel humbly before the magnificence and courage of your sacrifice on the altar of our salvation. May we always honour the promises made at our baptism to be faithful to the powerful love beating at the heart of your ministry. Let us seek and find the pure and innocent heart of the child which lies sleeping within us, waiting for us to awaken it and let it lead us joyfully through the green and fresh pastures of our true home.

Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood – As we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus which marked the beginning of His public life and ministry, we pray that each of us will respond positively to the universal call to holiness, thinking especially of those the Lord is inviting to serve His people as priests of the diocese of Derry.
