

A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 13: 1-23

Today's Gospel poses a deep-reaching and challenging question to those who have the courage to explore it with a truthful heart. The sower in the parable is Jesus; the seed is the word of God; the soil is the human heart. The seed which falls on the path is the word of God reaching hearts which are dull and uncomprehending. The seed falling on rocky ground is the word which initially may be received with joy, but the heart it reaches has no staying power. The seed which falls on thorny ground is the word of God choked by a heart which has succumbed to the lures and false promises of the material world. The seed which falls on rich soil is the word received by a heart which is open, loving and faithful, a heart in which the word flourishes and thrives. The word may be watered by tears, but the heart that receives it never fails. It never falters. It remains open to each day's glorious revelations about love and forgiveness, about compassion and suffering. It is a heart staunch and faithful which walks hand in hand with Jesus, right to the end of the road, living out his ministry of love each day under his beautiful, loving gaze.

The question posed by today's powerful and challenging Gospel is this: what kind of soil is each one of us who has been privileged to hear the word of God? What is the nature of our hearts? Are we deaf and uncomprehending? Are we initially attracted to the word of God but too shallow to allow it to take root in our lives? Are we so drawn to worldly power, to control and possessions, that adherence to the humility, gentleness, forgiveness and generosity of Jesus' ministry of love proves too daunting for our greedy hearts?

It is a question which, if we answer it in all honesty and respond positively to the truth it reveals, can effect a change in our lives rich in glorious possibilities. We can move from that state of enervation and torpor which characterises lives lived with either a lukewarm faith or faithlessness itself, and experience instead the gentle strength of Jesus' hand holding ours, the steadiness of his step as he walks beside us. We can experience indescribable happiness as we look into his beautiful face and his loving gaze holds ours. We can hear, as we come to the end of our journey, our Father's voice gently welcome us into eternal bliss: "Enter, good and faithful servant, and take the seat I have reserved for you."
