# A short Gospel reflection Luke 18:1-8

In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus shares the parable of the unjust judge—a man who neither fears God nor respects others—and a persistent widow who keeps coming to him, seeking justice. Though the judge is indifferent, he eventually grants her request, simply because she refuses to give up.

This is a teaching parable, and one that invites close reflection. The widow's unwavering persistence is a model for our own relationship with God. She does not falter; she pleads tirelessly. In contrast to the unjust judge, God is merciful and compassionate, always ready to listen and to give us what we need for our growth in love, faith, and wisdom.

But we have a part to play: to place God at the centre of our lives, and to live in the light of our faith in Him. Jesus calls us to pray continually and never lose heart—not only in times of hardship, but in all aspects of daily life.

Prayer takes many forms. It might arise in a quiet moment—walking through nature, pausing at a traffic light, or sitting with a cup of tea—when we suddenly become aware of God's presence and offer a silent word of thanks or petition. Prayer can also be communal, lifting us in hope, deepening our love, and renewing our strength together.

To pray continually is to live with hearts open to God at all times. It means allowing Him to shape our thoughts, guide our actions, and fill our days with meaning. And when we persevere in this way—when we continue to pray without losing heart—we help ensure that, when the Son of Man comes, He will find not emptiness, but faith: rooted, growing, and alive in the world.

**Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood**: On Mission Sunday we pray for those working to spread the Gospel to the furthest ends of the world. Let's pray also for those who are and will be called to proclaim the Good News of God's love as diocesan priests.

The St Dymphna Mass with Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated at St Eugene's Cathedral on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> October at 7.30pm. This Mass is to give thanks to God for positive mental health and to pray for those who are struggling with mental health issues and those who care for them.

O Most Holy Virgin Mary, Queen of the most holy Rosary, you were pleased to appear to the children of Fatima and reveal a glorious message. We implore you, inspire in our hearts a fervent love for the recitation of the Rosary. By meditating on the mysteries of the redemption that are recalled therein may we obtain the graces and virtues that we ask, through the merits of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer. Amen.
