A short reflection on today's Gospel John 20: 1-9

Today's Gospel calls us to accompany Mary of Magdala as she makes her heartbroken way to the tomb to minister to the precious lifeless body of her beloved Jesus. We share her shocked horror when she discovers the empty tomb. There are very few of us, having experienced the pain of the loss of a loved one, who have not faltered under the crushing weight of the absence of that loved one: the empty tomb experience is a deeply human one.

But the darkest part of the night is just before the dawn. We have travelled with Jesus on his excruciating journey to Calvary. We have witnessed his agony as he is reviled, abused, humiliated, mocked, tortured. But soon the empty tomb will liberate the disciples understanding of the teaching of scripture, 'that he must rise from the dead'. Soon the heartbroken Mary of Magdala's tears will be wiped away as Jesus tenderly calls her name.

The cross which seemed to be the end of all hope becomes the source of all life; Jesus is alive in our midst today as the beautiful, pure spring of all love, kindness, generosity, justice and peace.

Jesus, you are the true, beautiful, place of peace within us, the place of rest which helps us to bear the darkness. May we never forget that we are Easter people, people of the resurrection, loving each other as you have so loved us through your cross and passion.


