

A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus lives and walks among us today and every day: he has never left us and will never leave us. That is the awe-inspiring message of today's Gospel. He lives in every destitute person who exists, in every person who is in pain, every person who is sick, hungry, cold, homeless, in prison. He looks out of the eyes of every child terrified by the inhumanity of a world at war.

Jesus makes it clear that only those who see him in suffering humanity and who respond with compassion, will enter the kingdom of heaven. It is not enough to obey the law and keep one's hands clean: we are commanded by Jesus in today's Gospel to put our faith into action wherever we see the need. We must be imitators of Jesus in every way, a command which should jolt us out of any trace of complacency we might be harbouring, because to be an imitator of Jesus is to carry his cross uncomplainingly. It is to reach out always to those in need. It is to find the courage within to love those we might think are unlovable, to forgive those we might think are unforgiveable.

The way of Jesus leads to eternal life, but it is not an easy way. Let us not fail to recognise Jesus on every step of that way. He is the person reaching his hands out to us in supplication.

National Year of Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood – We pray for those who hope to serve as priests of the diocese of Derry, that they will play their part in building up the Kingdom of Christ from Aghyaran to Coleraine, from Malin Head to Bellaghy. Bishop McKeown has said, "We will be more like the Holy Spirit-filled Body of Christ when our diocese is blessed with many families of faith, people of all ages exploring and developing their faith, official ministries of Lector, Acolyte, and Catechist, the presence of consecrated virgins, female and male religious, permanent deacons, and ordained priests."

Our Lady, Untier of Knots Novena concludes after 7.30pm Mass this Thursday 30th November. We pray and entrust our specific "knots" to Our Lady's hands, learning how to let go of that which binds us.

The season of Advent begins on Sunday 3rd December. Take some time out from the pressures of getting ready for Christmas to pray and meditate on the true meaning of Advent.

Morning Prayer of the Church will be prayed in the Cathedral each morning at 7.45am, Monday to Friday beginning on Monday 4th December.

Late opening: In preparation for Christmas, the Cathedral will open late on the three Mondays during Advent (4th, 11th and 18th December) from 8.00pm to 10.00pm. During this time there will be an opportunity for Confession and prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

Eucharistic Adoration: every Sunday from 3.00pm to 6.00pm and every Tuesday from 10.30am until 7.20pm.

Saint Eugene's Carol Service will take place in the Cathedral at 4.00pm on Sunday 17th December. St Eugene's Cathedral Choir will lead the carols. We invite children to bring presents of new unwrapped toys and adults to donate sweets, biscuits, vouchers or cash. St Vincent de Paul Society will distribute the gifts.
