A short Gospel reflection Luke 11:1-13

In today's beautiful Gospel we witness Jesus, as he teaches his disciples to pray, also inviting us to join our faith with action. If the Kingdom of God is to come to earth, if God's will is to be done on earth as it is in heaven, then we must marry our faith to our lives. We must question our Christianity if it is only capable of stating its beliefs on paper, but doesn't have anything to show with our lives.

People like Francis and Clare of Assisi, as well as Mother Teresa of Calcutta, are examples of Christians whose lives bore witness to their faith. Mother Teresa was not a champion of unborn children because she wore a T-shirt that said "Abortion is Murder," but rather because she welcomed needy, suffering mothers and children into her life, and stated in essence, "If you cannot raise your child alone, we'll do it together."

Yes, we have a loving Father who will respond to our needs, day or night, if we ask and believe; but that loving Father also waits for us to respond, day or night, to the needs of our fellow suffering human beings as we humbly marry our faith to our actions.

Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood: In this weekend's gospel Jesus teaches His disciples - and us - to pray, and encourages us to ask persistently for the things we need, especially the gift of the Holy Spirit which we ask the Lord to pour down abundantly on our seminarians and those considering a vocation to the diocesan priesthood.
